Bible Words to Remember—"God delivers and rescues." Daniel 6:27

As a family, memorize this week's verse. Talk about the things kids fear. For some extra fun, use the **Play-Doh included in your kit** to make some of their fears- like snakes, spiders, lightning, etc. Remind the children that God is bigger and more powerful than our fears, and let them "smash" their fears.

BIG KIDS' CORNER

Instead of making the lion puppet, older kids can make a prayer pretzel. Pretzels are folded like hands in prayer.

You will find some bake-able polymer clay in your kit. As you roll the clay into the pretzel shape, talk about the scary things- the lions- in your child's life. Share how you go to God in prayer with your troubles and encourage your child to do the same.

Clay can be baked on oven proof glass or a metal pan at 275 degrees. Baking time depends on thickness of pretzel. 15 minutes for every 1/4 inch. It's paintable after it's baked!
